Communism	A system of government in which a single political party controls the government and the economy.
Socialism	A system of government in which the government controls economic resources.
Command Economy	An economic system controlled by the government, for example, socialism.
Constitutional Monarchy	A form of government in which a king or queen acts as head of the country, but only the elected Parliament make and pass laws.
European Union	An economic organization composed of 27 European member countries.
Holocaust	The mass slaughter by the Nazis of six million Jews and others during World War II
Nationalism	A strong sense of loyalty to one's country
Migration	The movement from one place to another; as in moving from one country to another
Infrastructure	The basic systems of a society such as roads, bridges, sewers, and electricity
